New Ways of Learning

Our team at Muirkirk have been using different approaches and mathematics aids to help our young people better understand new ideas.

An example of this is one of our pupils has been learning Place Value (Tens and Units). The place value blocks help to visualise the 'borrowing' element using conversion between tens and units. Also, in use is the number line strategy to help with subtraction.

Our pupil said: "My previous school never showed how to do this like that, this is easier now and I like doing this."

First Aid Qualifications

Our senior pupils across both our schools had the opportunity to complete a First Aid Qualification, gaining them a Level 6 qualification.

All the pupils who took part did a fantastic job listening to the presentation and taking part in the practical activities. We are delighted to share that every pupil (and staff member) who took part passed with flying colours!
